



2020 WINN/AAFP FELINE SCHOLARSHIP

Winn Feline Foundation and American Association of Feline Practitioners (AAFP) will award two \$2,500 scholarships to 3rd or 4th year students attending an accredited college of veterinary medicine in the United States or Canada.

Selection Process

Scholarship awards will be given based on the following priorities:

- The scholarship recipients shall be selected based upon academic achievement, financial need, leadership, and dedication to and excellence in the study of feline medicine.
- Students are encouraged to consider both traditional and non-traditional careers as they move forward in their education to understand the many options the veterinary profession offers in feline medicine. These career interests include one \$2500 scholarship for a veterinary student with a feline practice interest and a second \$2500 scholarship for a veterinary student with a clinical scientific research interest.
- Students must complete 2 one-paragraph statements (150 words or less for each question) explaining their interest in feline health and welfare and their plans for future participation in feline medicine.

All applications will be reviewed, selected, and approved by Winn and the AAFP. The scholarship recipients will be required to provide a high resolution photograph (preferably with a feline member of the family) and additional information related to their interest in cats to be used in a press release.

Application Deadline

All applications and supporting documents must be received by **March 20, 2020**

Scholarship Distribution

Recipients will be notified of the awards on or before April 15th of the application year, and checks for each of the two scholarship amounts will be issued. Students may apply once annually.

Procedure for Application Process:

1. Complete the application and attach a single page resume to your completed application. Items to include on the resume are honors, memberships, volunteer activities, employment information, clinical trials or research projects, and publications, if any in feline medicine. Note the organization name, the city, state, country, and dates of activity. Application must be submitted as either a pdf or word doc format (Jpg or scanned documents will NOT be accepted.)
2. Attach your response to two questions (page 4):
 - a. Why do you have an interest in feline health and welfare?
 - b. What are your plans for future participation in feline medicine?
