Sarah qualified from Bristol University and spent four years in mixed general practice before setting up a behaviour medicine referral practice in 1992. She is an Honorary Lecturer in small animal behavioural medicine at Liverpool University Veterinary School and was an external tutor on the Postgraduate Diploma/MSc course in Companion Animal Behaviour Counselling at Southampton University from the inception of the course until 2008. Sarah is immediate Past President of the European Society for Veterinary Clinical Ethology and in 2002 became a Founding Diplomate of the European College of Veterinary Behavioural Medicine – Companion Animals and served as President of that College from 2002 to 2008. Sarah has a particular interest in the interplay between behaviour and physical illness in dogs and cats. Her interests in the field of feline medicine include the role of behavioural factors in feline obesity, lower urinary tract disease, cognitive dysfunction and infectious disease. She lectures extensively at home and abroad on behavioural topics.

Dr. Susan Little received her BSc from Dalhousie University (Nova Scotia, Canada) in 1983 and her DVM in 1988 from the Ontario Veterinary College, University of Guelph. She is part owner of two feline specialty practices in Ottawa, Canada. Jacqueline (Jacqui) C. Neilson, DVM, DACVB, graduated from the University of Florida, College of Veterinary Medicine in 1993. After two years in private practice, she was selected as the first Friskies PetCare Companion Animal Behavior Resident at UC Davis School of Veterinary Medicine. Upon successful completion of the residency program and board certification process in 1997, Dr. Neilson returned to Portland and opened a behavior referral specialty practice, the Animal Behavior Clinic, where she continues to practice today. Dr. Neilson also acts as a consultant for companies and as a visiting instructor at Oregon State College of Veterinary Medicine. She served as the secretary-treasurer for the American College of Veterinary Behaviorists from 2000-2006. She is past President of the Oregon Veterinary Medical Association and is a member of the Board of Trustees of the Oregon Humane Society and Feral Cat Coalition of Oregon. Recent publications include chapters in The Veterinary Clinics of North America, Update on Clinical Veterinary Behavior and in BSAVA Manual of Canine and Feline Behavioural Medicine. Her first book, Blackwell's 5 Minute Veterinary Consult, Clinical Companion Canine and Feline Behavior, co-authored with Dr. Debra Horwitz was published in 2007. Dr. Neilson is a member of Veterinary Medicine's Editorial Advisory Board. She frequently lectures to veterinarians, their staff and the public about animal behavior. When she is at home she enjoys the company of her husband, dog and four feline companions.
